The Africa Centre for Holistic Management (ACHM)

ACHM is a Zimbabwean-registered social welfare organisation affiliated with the Savory Institute as the first member in its global network of hubs, or learning centres. Based on the 3,200-hectare Dimbangombe Conservancy, near Victoria Falls, ACHM has been able to demonstrate the effectiveness of Holistic Management and Holistic Planned Grazing on its own land for over a decade. From this solid foundation of proven results ACHM began working directly with local communal farmers in 2005 and with NGO's and government agencies in 2010 following receipt of a five-year, multi-million dollar grant from the US Agency for International Development to develop a training of trainers program to extend the knowledge more rapidly.

Allan Savory and his wife, Jody Butterfield, co-founded the Africa Centre for Holistic Management in 1992 to support the dissemination of Holistic Management in Africa through innovative training and outreach programs based on a practical learning site that provides evidence of land, water and wildlife restoration using livestock.



Tours Offered in March

The first of two tours will take place on March 10th and will showcase the work of the Dimbangombe Conservancy Learning Site and how Holistic Planned Grazing has led to the restoration of key ecological processes and aligns with social and economic complexities. This tour will last approximately 8 hours including transport to and from the site. Lunch will be provided at the ACHM facilities.

The second tour will visit the Ndlovu community near Victoria Falls whose members have been managing holistically under the guidance of ACHM partner, IGugu Trust, and are eager to share their stories, outcomes and successes. This tour to the Ndlovu Community will last approximately 5 hours including transport to and from the site. A traditional lunch will be provided by the community.

Visa and Border Crossing from Zambia

ACHM is situated just 35 mins from the City of Victoria Falls in Zimbabwe. Thus, attendees who wish to Visit ACHM for either or both the field days, but who are attending the conference in Livingstone, Zambia, are advised to ask for a KAZA UNIVISA on entry, regardless of whether you are entering Zambia or Zimbabwe. The KAZA UNIVISA costs USD 50 and allows tourists to obtain one visa to visit both countries multiple times in a single trip, saving cost and time on crossing. The visa is valid up to 30 days in any given period of 12 months, as long as the holder remains within Zambia and Zimbabwe. If you do not get a KAZA Visa, you will be required to obtain a stand alone Visa to cross, but with the KAZA it is no extra cost, and will be more convenient.
